## **NEWS ATOMS—Alan Warren**

**Ronald E. Majors** will receive the ACS Award in Chromatography at the Spring meeting in New Orleans. The award recognizes outstanding contributions to the field of chromatography and long service to the separation science community. The award is sponsored by MilliporeSigma. Majors is a retired senior scientist with Agilent Technologies.

Also at the Spring meeting, **Donna M. Huryn** will be honored with the Francis P. Garvan – John M. Olin medal for a unique combination of leadership in medicinal chemistry, service to the chemistry community, and unwavering commitment to improve the lives of women in chemistry. Huryn is professor of practice at the University of Pennsylvania and adjunct professor of

pharmaceutical sciences at the University of Pittsburgh. The endowed award fund was established by Francis P. Garvan and the Olin Corporation.

**Michelle M. Francl**, the Frank B. Mallory professor of chemistry at Bryn Mawr College, authored the recent book *Steeped:The Chemistry of Tea*, published by the Royal Society of Chemistry. Francl was elected a Fellow of the American Chemical Society in 2009 and was the 2019 recipient of the ACS Philadelphia Section Award.

**Roy Vagelos** and his wife Diana recently donated \$83.9 million to fund science initiatives at Penn's school of arts and sciences. Vagelos majored in chemistry before going on to receive his medical degree. He is the retired chairman and CEO of Merck & Co.

The 756<sup>th</sup> Board Meeting of the Philadelphia Section, ACS, was called to order at 7:02 PM and Matthew Irwin read the ACS Code of Conduct.

#### I. Roll Call

Roll was taken, a quorum was present, and the meeting began.

#### II. Approval of Meeting Minutes

- The November 9, 2023, 754<sup>th</sup> minutes were approved with few amendments
  - Victor Tortorelli was listed as present, but was revised as excused
  - Jim Murray was first to make motion and Sharon Haynie seconded motion
  - o December 14,2024, 755<sup>th</sup> BoD meeting minutes were approved with no amendments

#### **III.** Officers' Reports:

- Chair Matthew Irwin
  - Meet ACS committees and topical groups at Workhorse Brewing Company
    - The event will take place on Wednesday, January 17<sup>th</sup> from 5-8 PM in King of Prussia
    - This is an outreach networking event which will also allow committee chairs and topical groups leaders to discover what the Philly ACS has to offer. This will also provide a space to work on goals and topics to work on this year and next year
  - Lecture at Science History Institute
    - Thursday January 18th at 6 PM Dr. Kenan Sahin is presenting on Restoring American Industrial Legend: TIAX and Arthur D. Little Company
    - Dr. Sahin will tell the story of how this led to the innovation of a technology consulting firm that became influential in chemistry, chemical engineering, and at MIT
- Immediate Past Chair—Graham Dobereiner
  - Sections 2023 Annual Report
    - Will reach out to members for completion which is due in one month
    - Must have required material for annual report by certain date next week
    - Chem Wars was nominated for Chem Luminary
    - It was suggested to have Project Seed nominations for most improved student
  - 2024 Seed Program is hosting 15 to 20 students
  - Amending past motion as confusion arose from November to identify funds. It was amended that organizers receive \$5,200 instead of \$3,200

Chair-Elect – Wei Gao

- Lunar new year banquet 2024 Year of the Dragon taking place on Thursday, February
   15th from 6-9 PM
  - Cost to attend event are \$60 per professional and \$30 per student
  - This is a networking event with local chemists from ACS philly, e-CACs, CACA, ACP Joint event and local students.
    - It is better to accept payments through other sources such as Venmo, Paypal, or cash
    - e-CAC = Eastern Chapter of Chinese American Society
    - CACA = Chinese American Chromatography Association
    - ACP = Asian American Chemistry Professionals
  - It was suggested to mention that dinner starts at 7 PM on flyer and networking hours will be from 6-7 PM
  - It was mentioned to avoid Eventbrite because it is too expensive and includes ticket fees
  - During the event the CACA will give a brief introduction around 7 or 7:30 PM
  - This event also overlaps with other events:
    - Penn, Drexel, and Temple students likely to be attending Philadelphia Organic Chemistry Club (POCC) which starts at 6:30 and ends at 9

    - \$5,000 was suggested for 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary to balance budget which was increased and approved to \$7,500. This will result in \$2,500 less invested
    - It was discussed that \$300 was allocated for the the Lunar New Year's Celebration
    - Meals should be covered by sponsorships or setting right price for food
